

Surrey Branch Pistol & Revolver Competitions and their Trophies/Cups

Each year, the branch holds five pistol and revolver competitions that are currently shot at Bisley, stretched out across about 4 months to allow all members to be able to take part.

One of these competitions, the Repro Revolver Competition, also has a secondary Cup that is awarded to the highest non-winning score achieved by a member who has not won a Branch competition before. **Repro Revolver**



Sterling Silver lidded Cup on a 2 tier wooden plinth, made in Sheffield in 1894. First awarded in 1975.

EPNS trophy – no maker's marks on a traditional Bakelite plinth. First awarded in 1986.

Original Revolver



EPNS plated cup, no maker's name on a Bakelite plinth. First awarded in 1989.

Notable past winners: Dave Robinson, Brian Johnston, Mick Lunn, Paul Roberts and George Tondryk.

Smoothbore Flint Trophy



Sterling silver cup on a Bakelite base with an added walnut plinth, made in Chester in 1928 (walnut extension with sterling silver name plate, added in 2016 and made by Peter Jones). First awarded in 1984.

Notable past winners: Jim Greathead, John Pollock, Brian Johnston, Mick Lunn, Alan Osborne, Robbie Haig, Peter Jones, Paul Roberts and George Tondryk.

Percussion Pistol



Sterling silver cup on a Bakelite base, made by Bravington's in London 1930. First awarded in 1988.

Notable past winners: Alan Osborne, Jim Greathead, Mick Lunn, Robbie Haig, Paul Roberts, Peter Jones and Terry Pearce.

Open Frame Revolver



Miniature model Colt 1851 revolver mounted on a mahogany base with brass plaques made in Farnborough in 2010 by George Tondryk and first awarded in 2010.

Notable past winners: Paul Roberts, Terry Pearce and George Tondryk.

All Branch competitions are shot on a PL7 target face, standard 10 ex 13 MLAGB/MLAIC shots, and each competition target must have an affixed, paid for, competition sticker prior to shooting.
